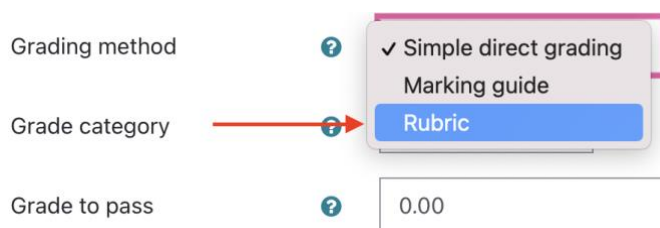


RUBRICS

Rubrics can be added to assignments, forums, and other graded activities in Moodle. To add a rubric to your activity or assignment, follow the instructions below.

ADDING A RUBRIC

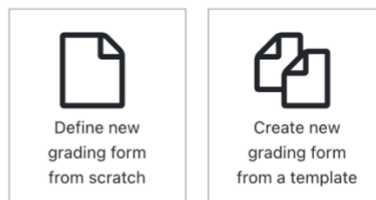
Go to activity or assignment where you would like to add a rubric. Scroll down to the “Grade” section of the assignment editing panel. Go to the “Grading Method” and change it from “Simple Direct Grading” to “Rubric.” Then, click “Save and Display” at the bottom of the page.



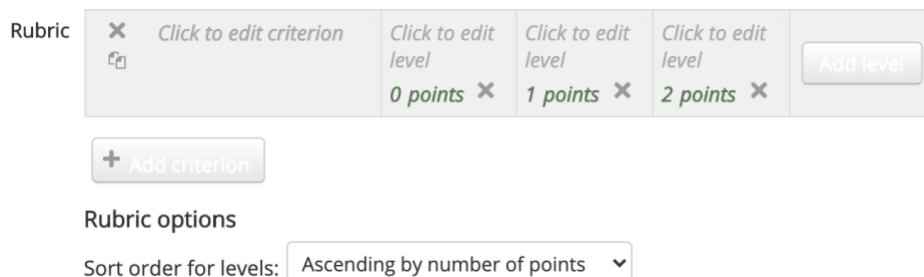
Select “Define new grading form from scratch” and this will bring you to the Rubric page.

Advanced grading: Collaboration Tool Assignment (Submissions)

Change active grading method to Rubric



Now you can enter the criteria and points into your rubric.



You can add criteria and levels to your rubric until it is complete. When you are finished click on save. The rubric will now be visible when you go to grade submissions.
